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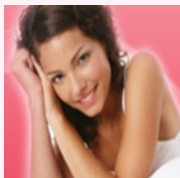

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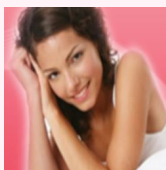

I don't want anyone to have to go through what I did.

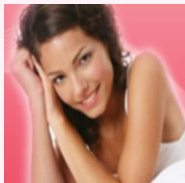

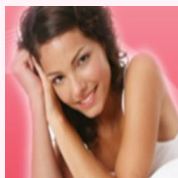
